Day 1

Day- 1 Welcome To The Land of the Pharaohs

An air conditioned, comfortable car will then take you to your hotel in Cairo so you can rest and prepare for your adventure.

Day 2 Giza Great Pyramids, Sphinx and Saqqara tou

Starting The solar eclipse in Egypt tour, in Cairo.

Our tour guide will meet you. After starting the day with an eclipsed sun, the Great Pyramids of Giza await you. The second largest pyramid will come first to meet you, and the famous monuments of the world.

The Great Pyramids of Giza

Where the most famous ancient monuments of Egypt are, during your visit to The Pyramids of Giza, You will see the Great Pyramid of Khufu, the largest pyramid constructed and the only surviving Wonder of the Ancient World, along with the impressive Khafre Pyramid, easily identified by the casing stones still covering its summit, and the smaller Pyramid of Menkaure with its particular architectural style. The Great Sphinx, with the body of a lion and the head of a pharaoh, will be guarding Giza with the Pyramids taking over the whole place.

Later, you will make your way to Saqqara to see the Pyramid of King Djoser, the first major stone structure in the world and also a UNESCO world heritage site:

Step Pyramid of Djoser

The one designed by the architect Imhotep, this innovative monument, the Djoser Pyramid, establishes the earliest form of pyramid building in ancient Egypt.

After an intense morning of exploring the past, you can take it easy and have a hearty meal at a traditional restaurant before your transfer to the airport for your flight to Aswan.

Day 3

Day 3 - Fly To Aswan

After arriving at Cairo Airport, you will take your flight toward the picturesque city of Aswan. Your Egypt tour begins when your prearranged guide walks out of the terminal to welcome you after your arrival. Travelers can start by observing the High Dam, created by 1960s engineers:

High Dam:

A major modern engineering project built to control Nile flooding, the High Dam, generate electricity, and create the vast Lake Nasser for irrigation and water management

After touring the High Dam, you will travel to the Temple of Isis situated on Philae Island. The Greco Roman era temple exists as a sacred place that celebrates Isis, the Egyptian goddess of Love and Magic:

Philae Temple

Famous for its elegant pillars, detailed carvings, and serene riverside setting, <u>the Philae Temple</u>, dedicated to Isis, the powerful goddess of magic, motherhood, and protection, remains one of Egypt's most enchanting monuments.

Your last stop for seeing ancient Egyptian carving techniques that resulted in both obelisks and deity statues of kings and gods is the granite site that houses an Unfinished Obelisk:

Unfinished Obelisk:

The largest known ancient obelisk ever attempted, the <u>Unfinished Obelisk</u>, showcasing how ancient Egyptians carefully cut, shaped, and planned massive granite monuments with remarkable skill

After your lunch in a local dining restaurant, you will proceed to your hotel to rest and enjoy your free evening in Aswan.

Optional tour: The Nubian Village tour in Aswan.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Visits: Philae Temple, Unfinished Obelisk.

Day 4

Day 4 Abu Simbel Temples tour

Reveal the Abu Simbel Temples, where Pharaoh Ramesses II stood watch over the entrance, his face carved in time for as many centuries as you can imagine:

Abu Simbel Temples:

Two massive rock cut temples built by Ramesses II, <u>the Abu Simbel Temples</u>, are famous for their colossal statues, precise solar alignment, and remarkable relocation to save them from the rising waters of Lake Nasser.

To visit a temple is more than a religious ritual when you walk where the ancient kings walked. You will be astonished at the craftsmanship of the buildings and their enduring monumental grandeur, which demonstrate the creativity of human beings in the past.

You will take a train to start your tour to Luxor.

Overnight aboard your Nile cruise.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

Visits: Abu Simbel Temples.

Day 5

Day 5 Attend the Solar Eclipse phenomena at Karnak Temple

August 2, 2027Start the day at the Karnak Temple, where the celestial phenomenon shines in the glow

of the mystery of ancient Egypt after having breakfast at your hotel

Karnak Temple:

The largest religious complex ever existing, the Karnak Temple, is adorned with enormous columns,

sacred lakes, and numerous shrines dedicated to the Theban gods.

The moon will project a shadow on the sun quietly, and an amazingly unnatural sense of twilight will

recreate the above surroundings before your eyes. The stars will peer over the daylight blue sky, and

the corona a brilliant aurora of flames will glow around the moon's shadow for 6 minutes and 23

seconds of celestial sight.

Visit the Luxor Temple, another extremely opulent destination on your Egypt trip:

Luxor Temple:

A grand temple complex built by Amenhotep III and Ramesses II, the Luxor Temple, is known for its

majestic statues, soaring columns, and its stunning golden appearance in the afternoon sunlight.

During lunchtime on your Egypt tour, dine at a common eating place before going back to your Luxor

hotel.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner.

Visits: Kom Ombo Temple, Temple of Horus in Edfu.

Day 6

Day 6 Kings Valley, Hatshepsut Temple and Colossi of Memnon tour

Starting the day eating breakfast leisurely in your hotel and then boarding to reach the western Luxor

bank.

The sandy landscape of this side of the Nile holds the secrets of ancient times.

Travel to the Valley of the Kings to see royal pharaoh tombs filled with hieroglyphics that maintain their eternal messages on the walls:

Valley of the Kings:

A royal burial site containing the tombs of New Kingdom pharaohs, the Valley of the Kings, richly

decorated with vivid hieroglyphs, symbolic funerary art, and treasures for the afterlife.

An Egyptologist guide today functions as a current day expert who interprets these heavenly visions.

Then, you will head to the Hatshepsut Temple, which stands at the spot where the Female Pharaoh

rebelliously managed to rule despite societal expectations during her time while the desert sun gently

warms your flesh:

Hatshepsut Temple:

A stunning terraced complex, Hatshepsut Temple, built into limestone cliffs, honoring Egypt's most

powerful female pharaoh.

The Colossi of Memnon provides an afternoon shade inside the gateway to ancient Thebes at the time

of noon:

Colossi of Memnon:

Two massive seated statues of Amenhotep III, the Colossi of Memnon, that once guarded his grand

mortuary temple and have stood watch over the Nile for more than 3,400 years.

Enjoy your local restaurant meal and relish actual Egyptian culture before your professional driver

takes you to Luxor Airport just in time for your flight to Cairo.
